


## Creating a Student Account in edmodo

1. Go to <http://edmodo.com>.
2. Have students click "I'm a Student."
3. They will need to put in the group code and fill out all other information (with the exception of the e-mail address – this is a nice feature for those schools who cannot have students having e-mail addresses).

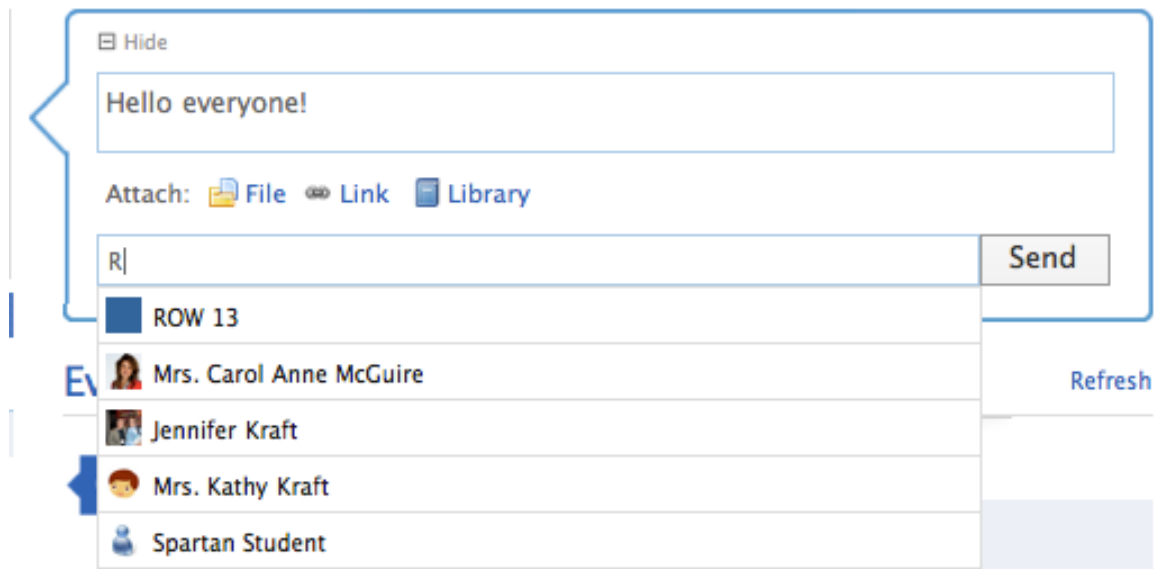
4. The home area for the student account looks and works very similarly to the teacher account with a few exceptions. They cannot create groups and they cannot make connections or send messages to single students.

5. To have students join other groups, share the group code with them for each group you want them to be a part of.
6. Remind students that you will see EVERYTHING that they type. They cannot get rid of things they write.
7. Remind them as well to be sure that they are sending messages to the correct group. After typing in the message, they need to start typing the name of the correct group and then click the correct group to send to.
