

## Directions for Teacher's Creating edmodo Accounts

1. Go to <http://edmodo.com>.



2. Click "I'm a Teacher."

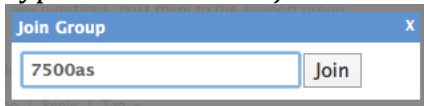
3. Fill in the account information using your school e-mail address.

4. Once you've created your account, "Mr. Edmodo" will welcome you and give you some options for starting to use edmodo.

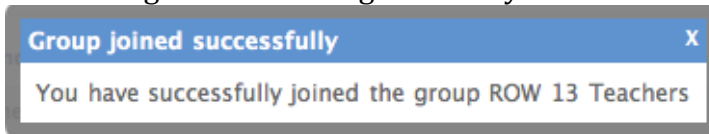
5. The first thing you should do is to join our ROW Teachers group. Click “Join” under the edmodo man.



6. Type in this code to join the ROW Teachers group:



7. You will get a message saying you’ve joined the group. You can click the X to close this message window and go back to your edmodo home.



It will also show that you are part of the group under the edmodo man.



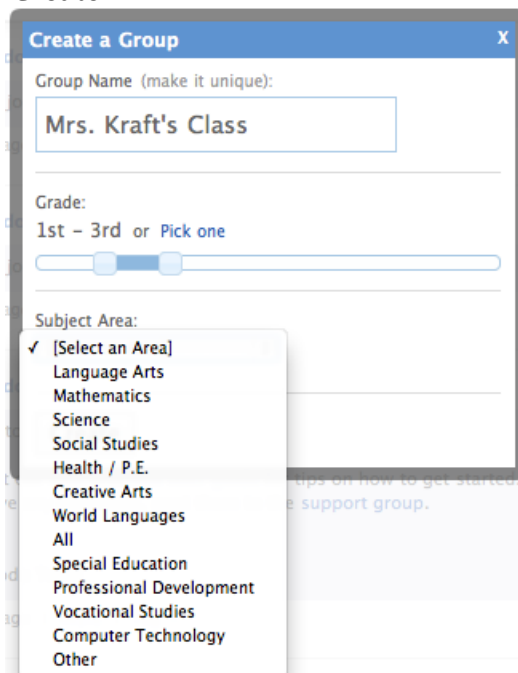
8. The next step is to join the group set-up for students and teachers. This code is: ww1m9j. After you've joined this group, your "Groups" should look like this:



9. After this, I would suggest creating a group for your students. To do this, click "Create" under the edmodo man.



10. Name your group, select a grade or a grade range, and select a class. Then click "Create."



11. When you've created a group, you will get a message from "Mr. edmodo." It will give you a group code that you will give to your students when they join edmodo.



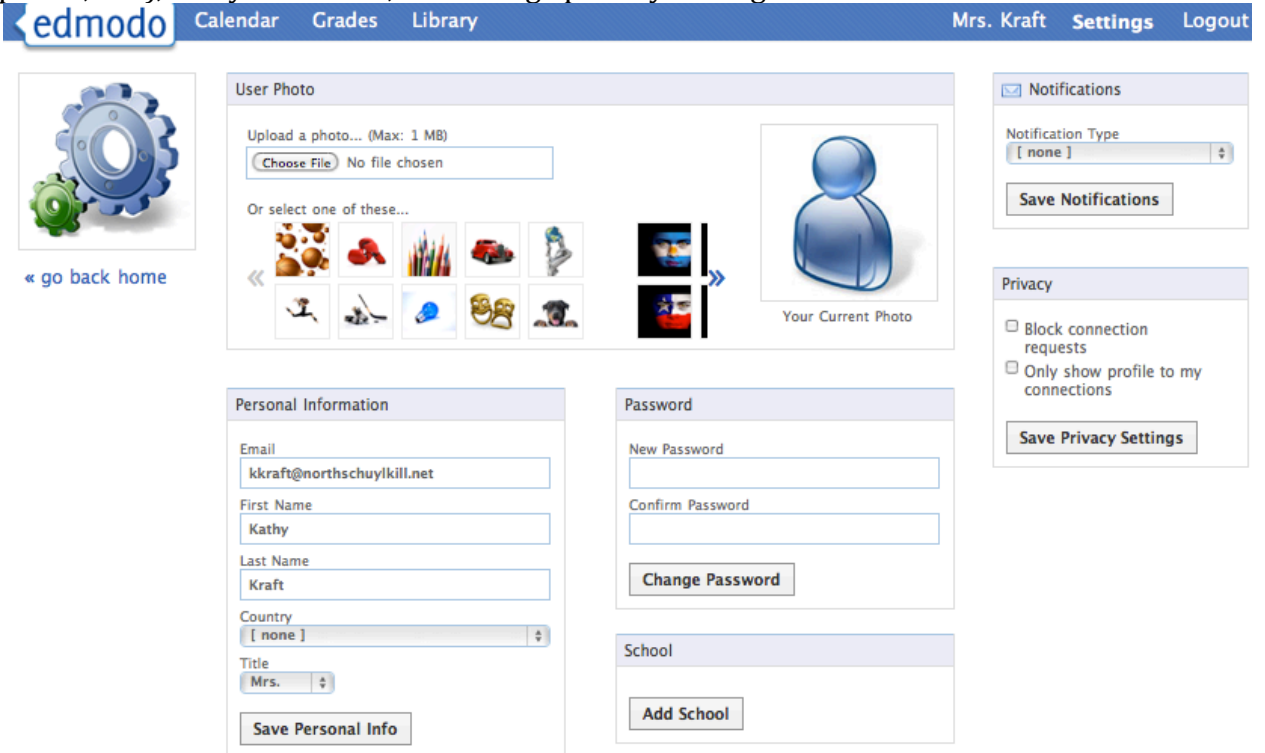
Do not worry if you lose the code. You can always find it in your history by selecting "Direct" from under the edmodo guy.



12. Now you can personalize your account a bit more by clicking "Settings."



13. Here you can add your picture, change your password, add notifications (for cell phone, etc.), add your school, and change privacy settings.



14. Anytime that you get stuck and want to get back to your home page, click the edmodo tag.

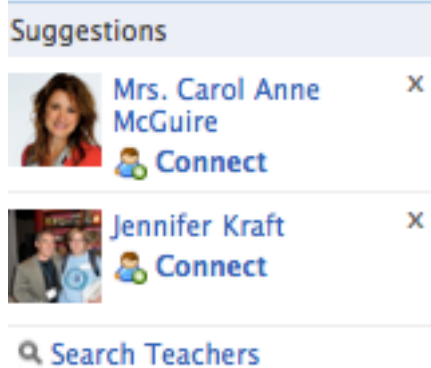


15. There is a “Spotlight” section in the top right that tells you when you have a direct message from someone, if there is a new reply, or if there is something else that you should take note of.

16. You can also “connect” with other teachers. This helps if you want to send messages just to them. I suggest connecting to all teachers in the project.
